

## **SHOTGUN RANGE LAYOUT.**

1. Both the firelock and caplock shotgun range layout will consist of 5 stations on level ground, 8 metres behind the trap. Stations shall be located 70 degrees left, 35 degrees left, central, 35 degrees right and 70 degrees right of a centre line through the trap.
2. A ready line will be created 1 metre behind the central station in each layout, and extending left and right at 90 degrees from a centre line through the trap.
3. A fixed trap shall be used, adjusted so that it throws a clay target to pass through a 1 metre hoop positioned 2 metres above and 10 metres in front of the trap, and which will strike the ground 60 metres in front of the trap.
4. The scorer shall be positioned so as to be able to confirm the R O's call of HIT or MISS.

## **STANDARD SHOTGUN MATCH SPECIFICATIONS**

1. The standard firelock and caplock shotgun match will consist of 15 to 20 clay targets, as specified by the match organisers, shot at a distance of 8 metres, (see shotgun range layout above). The State and Australian Titles will consist of a minimum of 20 clay targets.
2. A standard muzzle loading shotgun match permits both firelock and caplock shotguns to compete in the same event, with standard caplock match rules to apply.
